The Men's Ministry at LPCC will be celebrating our first anniversary next month, and we are excited to share some big things that are happening. Throughout our journey, we have seen God's hand in allowing us to reach young men needing emotional, educational, and spiritual support. Because of a generational pattern of fatherless homes and negative cultural influences, we are seeing men without the skills to be good fathers and husbands. At LPCC, we provide emotional support by giving men a safe, nonjudgmental place to talk about problems associated with their partners' pregnancy, difficulties with being a dad, and being a good role model for their family. We provide educational support through our Brightcourse program, equipping men with the tools needed to be good dads and husbands. We also provide spiritual support by applying biblical truths and prayer. This ministry has seen tremendous growth in the last few months - we are currently averaging 3-4 men every Tuesday afternoon. In addition, this winter, we teamed up with Safe Harbor using our Brightcourse program to minister to the homeless men at the shelter. Health and Human Services has also started to refer men to enroll in our Fatherhood educational courses.

We're hoping to expand the number of male coaches in order to increase

the number of hours that we see men. At LPCC, our mission is to break that generational history and create better dads, husbands, and leaders. With your continued support and prayers, we are seeing that happening.
